Every policy environment is different. By identifying where you're already strong, and where you might encounter difficulties, you'll be better able to map a way forward that works for your specific context.

You can use this template to cover all three of the pillars—financing, licensing, and spectrum or on one or two focus areas. Use the results to plan and prioritize your work.

### Some prompt questions to get you started:

- What stage is your work at? Are there community-centered connectivity projects already up in running, or are you still in the planning stages?
- What types of financing are available in your country? Think about enterprise support, technology grants, universal service funds, even credit union loans.
- Are there licensing frameworks you've seen elsewhere that you'd be interested in exploring for your country?
- Has your country's spectrum policy ever been updated with a view to connecting the unconnected?

- Catalog of policy changes that are difficult to implement
- List of potential opposition anticipate and address pushback
- Examples of local or industry pressures affecting policy updates
- Explanation of risks of unsuccessful policy changes and negative impacts
